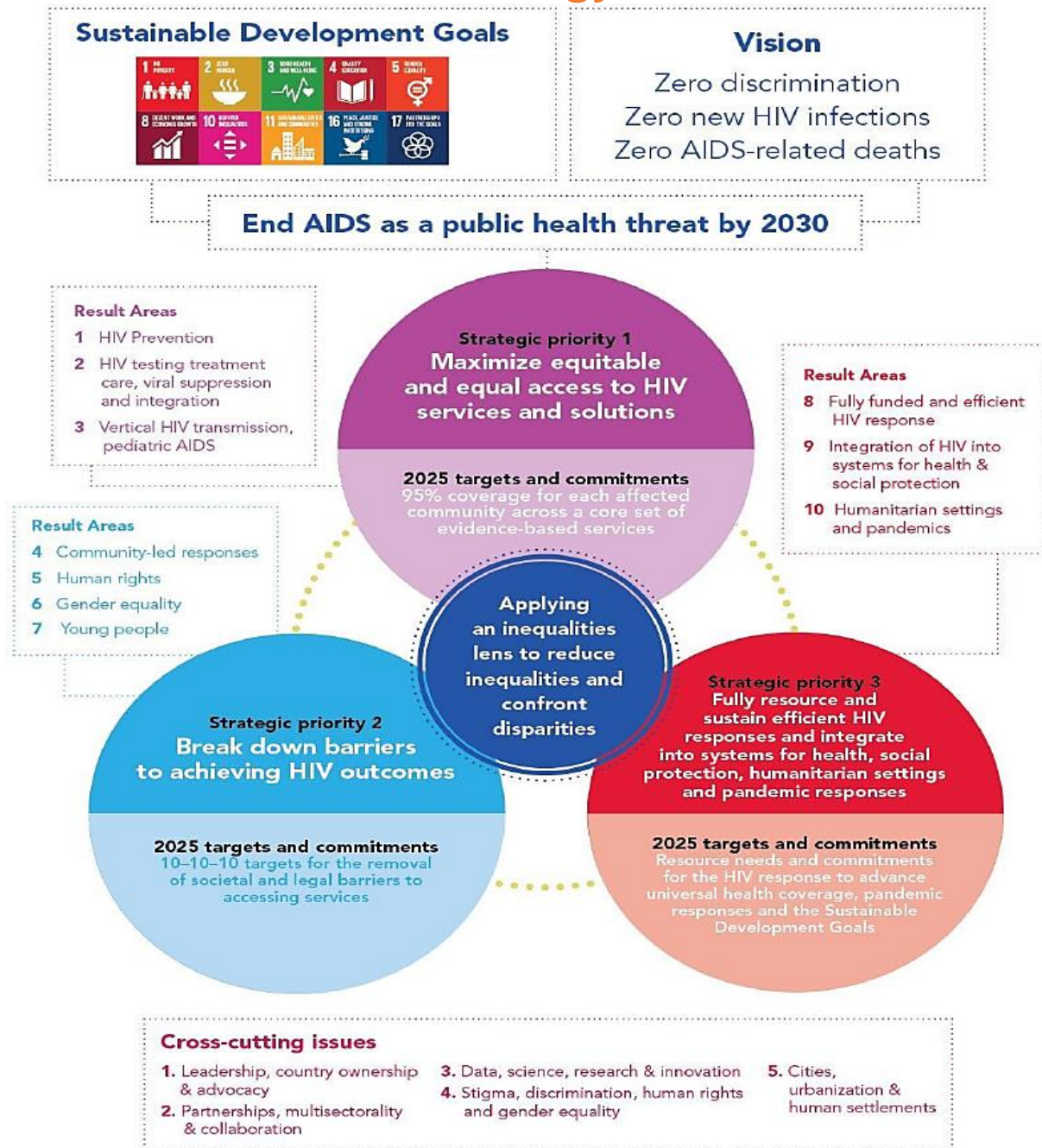

# Global AIDS Strategy 2021-2026: Framework



## Applying an inequalities lens across the strategic priorities

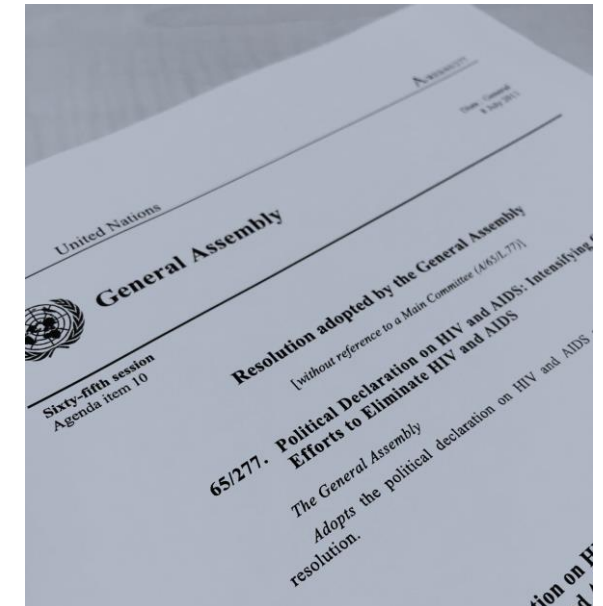
- Acknowledges the pressing challenges and opportunities, recognizes key shifts are needed to end AIDS.
- Aligned to Decade of Action & makes explicit contributions to advance goals and targets across 10 SDGs
- Keeps people at the centre to ensure they benefit from services, to remove social & structural barriers that prevent people from accessing HIV services
- Calls on governments, development & financing partners, communities & the UNAIDS to identify and address these inequalities

# Outcomes of the 2021 HLM

- Reviewed progress towards the 2016 targets and political declaration.
- **Endorsed new 2025 targets** that will ensure accountability and keep the world on track to End AIDS epidemic as a public health threat.
- Agreed a **new Political Declaration** to mobilize action for the next five years of the HIV response, towards achieving the goal of ending the AIDS epidemic by 2030.

# The Political Declaration on HIV and AIDS: Ending Inequalities and Getting on Track to End AIDS by 2030

- The new Political Declaration includes commitments:
  - Ending inequalities and engaging stakeholders to end AIDS
  - Effective implementation of combination HIV prevention (95% coverage by 2025)
  - HIV testing, treatment and viral suppression (95-95-95 by 2025)
  - Eliminate vertical transmission of HIV and end pediatric AIDS by 2025
  - Gender equality and empowerment of women and girls
  - Community leadership (services delivered by the communities - 30% for testing and treatment; 80% for prevention; 60% for societal enablers)
  - Realizing human rights and eliminating stigma and discrimination (10-10-10 targets)
  - Investment and resources
  - Universal Health Coverage and Integration
  - Data, Science and Innovation
  - Support Joint United Nations on HIV/AIDS



# The Political Declaration on HIV and AIDS vs NSP V

- NSP V

- **Principle: Multisectoral collaboration, people centered approaches and equity, gender equality, civil society participation, and evidence-based interventions.**
- **Strategy 1: Deliver comprehensive prevention, care, treatment and support through a multi-sectoral approaches**
- **Strategy 2: Integrate HIV response activities into the health system, relevant ministries and national coordinating bodies**
- **Strategy 3: Expand social protection coverage and improve access to health, social and legal services for PLHIV and KPs**
- **Strategy 4: Increase government financing to 50% of all HIV expenditure by 2023 and allocate a share of the government budget to CSOs for delivery of critical HIV services**

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- **Ending inequalities and engaging stakeholders to end AIDS**
- **Effective implementation of combination HIV prevention**
- **HIV testing, treatment and viral suppression**
- **Vertical transmission of HIV and pediatric AIDS**
- **Gender equality and empowerment of women and girls**
- **Community leadership**
- **Realizing human rights and eliminating stigma and discrimination**
- **Investment and resources**
- **Universal Health Coverage and Integration**
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- **Support Joint United Nations on HIV/AIDS**

## Way Forward

- Realization and operationalization of commitments in the Political Declaration based on local context
- Using political declaration as a leverage to reaffirm and reinvigorate multilateralism as pathways to strengthen holistic and people centered HIV response
- Effectively implement national policies and strategies inline with commitments made in the Political Declaration

## Immediate next steps

- 2021
  - Follow-up discussion on recalibration/finetuning/scaling -up activities in line with 2025 targets of the Political Declaration and the Global AIDS Strategy
- 2021 -2022
  - Review of sustainability roadmap (to stock take the progress and challenges(incl. those related to COVID-19), recommend course corrections/ recalibrations/inroads to stay on-track with the roadmap
- 2022
  - Leveraging the chairmanship of ASEAN member states, continued leadership as champion and strong advocate for the comprehensive HIV response in the region particularly around the development of Asia Pacific regional roadmap as part of follow-up action for the commitments made in the political declaration
  - NSP V review (end of strategy review to inform NSP VI)
