Resolution
of the First NAA Plenary Meeting of 2022
June 30th, 2022

The First NAA Plenary Meeting of 2022 was held for a full morning on June 30, 2022, at the meeting room “D” hall, Friendship Building of the Office of the Council of Ministers, with 160 participants. This included the leading members of the National AIDS Authority, chairpersons of AIDS committees of all ministries, institutions, 25 of Phnom Penh and provincial AIDS secretariats, HIV/ AIDS working groups, UNAIDS, USAID, and civil society organizations.

The whole meeting expressed deepest gratitude to Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo Hun Sen, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, for his admired wisdom in implementing effective measures to respond to the COVID-19 disaster, while maintaining macro-economic stability and positive social well-being for Cambodia. These practical measures have tremendously contributed to the fight against HIV/ AIDS.

The meeting also acknowledged all the institutions, at both the national and sub-national levels, national and international partners, civil society organizations, the network of PLHIV, and the network of key population for their continued work in response to HIV/ AIDS, despite the difficult situation of the COVID-19 pandemic.

After a wide range of discussion, all members pledged to continue the common will to successfully fight, prevent, and end the spread of HIV/ AIDS by achieving the Three Zeros principles (Zero new HIV infections, Zero discrimination, and Zero AIDS related deaths) by achieving the strategic goal of 95-95-95 by 2025 (95% of people living with HIV know their status, 95% of people who know their status are receiving treatment, and 95% of people on HIV treatment have a suppressed viral load).

Due to the concern of HIV transmissions among key populations, especially MSM, Transgender, entertainment workers, and Injecting Drug Users, the first NAA plenary meeting of 2022 adopts the resolution as follows:

1. Encourage the AIDS committee of ministries, institutions, Phnom Penh and provincial administrations to continue to work on the action and budget plan in accordance with the 5th National Comprehensive and Multi-Sectoral Strategic Plan for HIV/ AIDS response 2019-2023, focusing on the recommendations of the Mid-Term Strategic Plan Review (MTR) in accordance with the work mandate of relevant institutions, and to ask for support from the Ministry of Economy and Finance.

2. Continue to encourage the Ministry of Tourism and the sub-national administrations to implement a 100% condom policy in places such as hotels, beer gardens, karaoke and entertainment venues.
3. Encourage the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Women's Affairs, the Ministry of Social Affairs, Veterans and Youth Rehabilitation, and the sub-national administrations to promote the provision of preventative and protective care services to reduce mother to child transmission of HIV in a targeted manner.
4. Urge all sub-national administrations to establish commune/Sangkat AIDS committees by incorporating the representatives of PLHIV and key populations into the existing commune/Sangkat committee in charge of women and children's affairs.
5. Continue to encourage the National Center for AIDS, Dermatology, and STD (NCHADS) of the Ministry of Health to develop innovative methods and means so that 95% of the key population has access to the combination of HIV prevention services.
6. Encourage the Ministry of Health (NCHADS), sub-national administrations, and partner organizations to continue to find and persuade approximately 12,000 PLHIV, who have not yet received treatment, to take a blood test and get care and treatment in a timely manner.
7. Encourage the Ministry of Health (NCHADS) to expand coverage and enhance the effectiveness of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) to key populations at risk.
8. Request the Global Fund, through the Country Coordinating Committee, and all development partners to strengthen the country system, initiated by the National AIDS Authority, towards achieving a sustainable AIDS program in Cambodia.
9. Urge the Ministry of Economy and Finance and the National Council for Social Protection to work closely with the National AIDS Authority to help develop a national policy that is based on social contracting, with financial support, to allow non-governmental organizations and civil societies to be able to intervene in some areas of essential HIV/ AIDS response in the future.
